Introduction: Brief description of the program and program mission.

The purpose of the Adult Residential Care Home Operator program is to provide a continuous and adequate supply of care home operators for employment in the Adult Residential Care Home facilities of Hawaii County and the state of Hawaii. ARCH facilities provide 24 hour living accommodations for adults unrelated to the family who require at least minimal assistance in activities of daily living but who do not need the services of an intermediate nursing care facility. Care homes help build health communities by allowing residents to remain in their own community in a safe and homelike setting.

Part II.

According to the formula for determining program health the CHO program is unhealthy. However, the number of majors is incorrect because the data does not capture all the students due to the course starting at different points in the semester. The efficiency is incorrect because there is not an entire position devoted to CHO. The position is shared with the non credit certified nurses aide courses which do not show up in the indicators. The program is not effective in that none of the students who complete the series (4 credits of courses) are interested in applying for the certificate of completion. The numbers of males in the courses is typically less than the college goal of 25%. This is related to the fact that students in the program must be certified nurses' aides, typically a female occupation.

Significant Program Actions (new certificates, stop-out; gain/loss of positions, results of prior year's action plan).

In accordance with the 2008 action plan, the certificate of completion in CHO was deleted, thereby deleting the courses as a program. However, the courses will continue to be offered at least once a year. The faculty who teaches the CHO courses will continue to do so as well as teach non credit certified nurses' aide courses and refresher courses for CNAs.
